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# **One Ocean Science Congress: objectives**

The One Ocean Science Congress is the scientific pillar of UNOC3. The objectives are to:


- Provide Heads of States and Governments, all UNOC3 participants, and more broadly society, with a state of scientific knowledge on the ocean (functioning, ecosystem services, trajectory, health, conservation, exploitation, climate solutions...)
- Explore a wide range of scenarios on the future of the ocean (evolution of pressures, resilience, restoration potential, local or global public policies...)
- Assess the ocean's potential to contribute to the major transitions, energy, ecological, food..., included in the 2030 Agenda
- Formulate science-based recommendations to the international community gathered in Nice and include the ocean in the sustainable development objectives







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## **Themes, One Ocean Science Congress**

- T1: Integrating knowledge systems, with a focus on responsibility and respect for the ocean
- T2: Effectiveness, equitability and safety of ocean-based approaches to reach the mitigation and adaptation goals of the Paris Climate Agreement
- T3: Protection and restoration of marine and coastal ecosystems to ensure sustainable and equitable management
- T4: Knowledge of the deep ocean and ways to enable its sustainable use
- T5: Marine genetic resources: from discovery to equitable access and sharing of associated benefits

- T6: Transparency in the fisheries sector, including illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing
- T7: Sustainability, equitability, and safety of ocean-based food systems
- T8: Marine plastic pollution
- T9: Environmental footprint of maritime transport and decarbonization of shipping
- T10: Vibrant science to inform and support ocean action

# **General structure**

- About 2000 participants, with a particular attention dedicated to:
  - Participation of the Global South
  - Gender balance
  - Participation of early-career scientists
  - High ambition: financially support 200 participants from low and middle income countries
- 9 plenary keynote talks (2 per day)
- 88 time blocks for oral sessions (total: 616 oral presentations)
- 33 town halls (round tables, panels on interactions between science and society, action and policy), at lunch time 3 dedicated poster sessions
- Virtual poster presentations
